Lithuania is a little country wedged into a corner of the Baltic Sea. It is the largest of the Baltic States, but has the shortest Baltic coastline. Both its land mass (65,303 square kilometers) and population (~3 million) are similar to those of Ireland.

Lithuania shares borders with Latvia to the north, Belarus to the southeast, Poland and the Kaliningrad region of the Russian Federation to the southwest. Lithuania has been a member state of the European Un-



LITHUANIAN PSYCHODRAMA ASSOCIATION

Lithuanian Psychodrama Association (LPA) was established in 1999 and exists to promote and encourage the use of psychodrama throughout Lithuania.

By implementing its mission LPA:

Organizes psychodrama trainings and ensures ethical use of the method among practitioners;

Spreads information about psychodrama and its applicability in society by organizing psychodrama seminars, conferences and events;

Unites professionals and provides the space to share and discuss the best practices of psychodrama use.

Training

LPA organizes both 1st (basic) level and 2nd (qualification) level psychodrama trainings. Since 2004, when the first psychodrama training group was certified as psychodrama therapists, LPA has successfully organized 4 groups of the 1st level training and 1 group of the 2nd level training. Trainings are certified by PIfE (Psychodrama Institute for Europe, Berlin) and it ensures the recognition of psychodrama practitioners in Europe. LPA has already certified psychodrama teachers in Lithuania so 1st level trainings are fully led by Lithuanian teachers.

Seminars and conferences

Every year LPA organizes at least 1-2 seminars or conferences with foreign teachers, and 3-4 seminars with Lithuanian professionals. Some of the events have already become a tradition, like international conference "Baltic Moreno Days" which is organized in Lithuania every 6 years since 2004, or international event "Open stage" which is organized every year since 2013. LPA seminars and conferences attract not only Lithuanian psychodrama practitioners but also professionals from other countries and from other fields of work.



Memberships

- LPA is an institutional member of PIfE (Psychodrama Institute for Europe) since 2002. LPA entered PIfE with the intention to seek higher level of professional knowledge and to enlarge international relationships with psychodrama professionals all over Europe.
- Looking for ways to enlarge training competence LPA entered FEPTO (The Federation of European Psychodrama Training Organizations) in 2012 and continues being an active member since then.
- 2014 LPA became one of the founders of Lithuanian Psychotherapy Association (LPtA) and actively participates in creating a qualified psychotherapy practice in Lithuania.

Daiva Rudokaitė, psychodrama therapist, psychologist and professional actress, is a president of LPA since 2009. At the moment LPA has **53 members**.

IT'S TIME FOR SECRETS

WORKSHOP 1

SUE DANIEL (AUSTRALIA)

UNLOCKING THE SECRET: ROLE THEORY AND ROLE TRAINING FOR EVERYDAY LIFE.

Description:

We are often blind to the secret roles hidden within all of us, but we can find ways to nurture and encourage them to grow. This workshop will allow you to find your developed and undeveloped roles, helping to bring them out to use them in positive and productive ways. The potential for role repertoire development is always within us. The more we develop this repertoire, the more we increase our ability to be spontaneous and creative. A healthy and active imagination is at the heart of successful role theory and role training. It brings about lightness, playfulness and an exhilaration that can take us forward.

Presenter:

Sue Daniel is a psychodramatist and a psychotherapist in private practice. She works with individuals, couples and families. She also consults to a variety of organisations. She is the director of the Psychodrama Institute of Melbourne and the founder of the Moreno Psychodrama Society and the Australian and Aotearoa (New Zealand) Board of Psychodrama. Sue is an international trainer, educator and practitioner of psychodrama and she conducts workshops and seminars in communities, institutes and organisations worldwide. Her writing and research on psychodrama is published in books and journals. She loves learning and finding the freshness in the moment.



WORKSHOP 2

JORGE BURMEISTER (SPAIN)

SECRETS: A DANCE BETWEEN LIGHT AND SHADOW

Description:

This workshop will focus on archetypes, symbols and the relevant social practice in families and groups related with secrets. It will reveal the double nature of this universal human feature, its protective and connective aspect on the one hand and its destructive and manipulative aspect on the other hand. We will look on its cross-cultural dimension getting in contact with the meaning of secrets and silence in Japan, in India, for intuit people, gypsy people and for the indigenous people of South-, Central and North America. The main focus of this workshop, however, will help us to explore its significance for our own life. We will use active techniques, imaginary techniques, body work, arts and trans-cultural practices of group work. But please don't talk about it: it's a secret!

Presenter:

Dr. Jorge Burmeister is a psychotherapist, runs training in psychodrama, analytic group and family therapy, Jungian analysis, cognitive behavioral therapy (CBT) and hypnotherapy. He's also a supervisor in psychodrama and CBT. Jorge is the Co-Director of the "Training Institute for Integrative Psychotherapy and CBT" in Switzerland and of the international training center "J. L. and Z. T. Moreno" in Granada. He teaches as invited professor and lecturer on group psychotherapy at various universities in Europe and South America. Jorge is a founding member of the European Federation of Psychodrama (FEPTO). His special interests are trans-cultural psychodrama and psychotherapy, trauma and resilience, group work for communities and organizations, humanism and spirituality.

NORBERT APTER (SWITZERLAND)

SPEAKING OUT SAFELY THE UNSPOKEN IN TEAMS: THE DELAYED DIALOGUE TECHNIQUE

Addressing the unspoken is often an important step towards redynamizing a team. Even more: the higher the level of tension in the team, the more the unspoken ends up needing to come out in the open and to be taken into account in a possible conflict resolution. But speaking out the unspoken opens the space to such sensitive - at times tricky- interactions in a team! The most delicate attention must be given to such moments!

Norbert Apter has run - in the last 25 years - a great number of Team Caring, Team Building, and Conflict Resolutions / Mediations with teams. Since the teams have diverse levels of tension (between 0 and 10), he « created » and is successfully using, a technique which can provide a secure opportunity for speaking the unspoken in a team/group... be it « I love working with you ... » or « I have a difficulty with you... » etc. : The Delayed Dialogue technique.

Norbert Apter will share the ins and outs of this technique, as well as how it brings about a relational depth in a team, while strictly remaining in the professional realm.

WORKSHOPS

INARA ERDMANIS (SWEDEN, LATVIA) THE SECRET NEVER TOLD

We all have secrets out of shame or guilt or often respect for others. There are many different kinds of secrets. There are secrets we never ever would share and there are secrets that would be a relief to share and get rid of. The workshop will deal with our way of handling secrets and how they can possibly interfere with our daily life.

Inara born in Riga, Latvia and living in Sweden since the second World-war. Certified and mainly trained by Zerka Moreno (CP 1982) and **TEP** by Nordic Board of Examiners (1995). Supervisor for the European Institute of Psychodrama. Founder and leader of the Latvian Moreno Institute and have given education in Latvia since 1989. Clinical psychologist and certified psychotherapist (by the Swedish State). Trained as Body psychotherapist (teacher and supervisor). Got family training mainly by Satir, Kempler, Kirschenbaum and Gammar.

EDUARDO VERDU (NORWAY) SECRET AND LIES

We all have our secrets. Are secrets the same as lies, or do they lead us to lying? Can lies be inhereted through generations? Is it true that what we don't know won't harm us? We all have secret thoughts and feelings. Maybe we carry betrayal, abuse or memories that are caused by misunderstandings. I believe this all affects our value systems and therefore influences our lives more than we are aware of. Secrets and lies may leads to lack of confidence, insecurity, fear of intimacy and stuckness. In this workshop we will try to heighten our perception and understanding in the world of secrets and lies so a possible change can come. This workshop is experiential. Don't use that exotic word ideals. We have a good enough native word: lies. (From The Wild Duck by Henrik Ibsen).

Eduardo Verdu, T.E.P. Msc and director of the Norwegian Moreno institute in Oslo. He teaches, trains and supervise on levels in psychodrama in Norway as well as throughout Europe where he also is a requested workshop holder and has been holding numerous amount of workshops for more than 20 years. Eduardo is a board member of the Nordic Board of Examiners and vice chairman of Pife as well as holding the chair of the Training and Supervision committee of Pife.



JORGE BURMEISTER (SPAIN)

A HISTORY OF SHAME, A HISTORY OF PASSION

In our history secrets often cover the "not speakable", the taboo which once revealed might make damage to our need of feeling "good" or morally "innocent". But it is exactly the conscious working through of the invested pain and the invested shame in those events which frees our passion again and renew our commitment for life. One part of those secrets ("the hidden memory") might be directly expressed by our body or by emotional short cuts. On the other hand our secrets might host traces of archetypical wisdom and the potential to grow.

In this workshop we will learn techniques and procedures 1. How to mobilize and respond to the memory system of our body, our senses and our dreams and 2. How to transform those features of our unconscious into pieces of resilience. We will try to replace the compulsion to repeat by the freedom to remember. We will try to complete the tendency to suffer pain inflicted on us through our past by our choice to insist in our own life and to generate new hope and new light for our future. The theoretical background will embark the inspirational ideas of JL and Z Moreno, CG Jung, D Boadella (Body and Vital energy) and M Seligman (Positive Psychotherapy) who have been my main teachers for the work I am doing in the present.

JACOMIEN ILBRINK (THE NETHERLANDS) LIFTING THE VEIL....

"If you don't reveal yourself, people will invent you....." Aim of this sociometric workshop is to explore who we are through the eyes of others. Are you being chosen for what you want to be chosen for, or do you need to lift a tip of the veil? And the other way around: what do your personal choices say about you? All of this, of course, will be kept as the best known secret around... Ssst.

Jacomien Ilbrink is a Dutch psychodramatist and creative arts therapist, who was originally trained in America, New York. She has specialised in sociometry and trains internationally on the effective application of sociometry groups and organisations.

ALBINA KEPALAITĖ (LITHUANIA) WHAT IF... I WILL OPEN THIS DOOR OR WILL CHOOSE THIS ROAD?

How exploring and expanding this unknown develop us? With what aspects of our beings we will meet or confront? May be it would help us to overcome inertia, to free from ordinary conventions, to light frozen feelings and hopes... May be, but yet it is secret...

EVALDAS KARMAZA (LITHUANIA) STORIES - HIDDEN AND PROTECTED. HANDLING RE-SISTANCE WITH CARE AND DIGNITY

People build walls not for themselves. Walls are usually against something to come. Starting from clothes put also to protect body, continuing with lies, hiding true events, creating silence even when someone is knocking the door—this is the path what many start to learn in order to protect. Psychodrama offers many tools that are effective in dealing with people's resistance to disclose their stories and secrets.

This makes psychodramatists quite effective in approaching to the person's hard stories that were supposed not to be told, feelings not to be shown, memories that were supposed to be forgotten. And suddenly on stage, after warm-up or other spontaneous action mother, teenager, father, pupil says more than ever planned to say...

In this workshop we will look why psychodrama is so effective in coming to hidden stories so effectively and quite fast, but sometimes may create damage. We will explore how to come to sensitive secrets with dignity. Additional attention will be paid to cases of working with families or teenagers.

Evaldas Karmaza - Psychodramatist, psychologist, Chairman of PIfE (Psychodrama Institute for Europe). Professional experience in working with schools, legal investigations, teenager's behavior correction groups, family support meetings etc.

These two workshops are an examination of candidate of Certified practitioner at the Norwegian and Latvian Moreno institutes.



NORBERT APTER (SWITZERLAND)

TEAMBUILDING BASED ON ACTION METHODS: TRANSFORMING UNADDRESSED TENSIONS INTO RE-SOURCES

The TEAMBUILDING addresses a team with a medium level of tension (i.e. 4 to 6 out of 10),): problems exists, whether they be relational, functional or operational; some people don't speak out; some feel unheard; things don't change... The team needs to address diverse issues, some of them being conflictual, even though the conflicts are not (yet) too strong. Thus, a Teambuilding's overall objectives are: Diminishing the tensions and facilitating a constructive relational climate; Clarifying the team's functioning; Transforming problems;

Elaborating, as a team, renewed perspectives. Some of the expected results are: A substantial improvement of the team's climate of work; The establishment of an action plan for a better functioning; The enhancement of motivation and efficiency.

How to go about it with Moreno's method? This is the question that we will address in this workshop.

SUE DANIEL (AUSTRALIA)

FINDING, RESTORING AND INTEGRATING THE LINKS WITH OUR ANCESTORS THROUGH PSYCHODRAMA AND ROLE THEORY

Imprinted within us all are links to those who have come before. Our ancestors can be a source for our collective stories, dreams and fears. They may also hold the key to understanding some of the obstacles in our lives. For some people, exploring their ancestry may involve confronting painful life experiences; for others it may be about coming to terms with the choices their predecessors made and finding value and meaning from these choices. While some may find that bonds to our past need repairing, others may need to be released and transformed. This journey may uncover useful insights and wisdom, connecting us more deeply with our ancestral roots, inspiring us to move forward. Working with sociometry, psychodrama and role theory and using a range of techniques integrating the ancestral roles that emerge from our process, we will explore our ancestry, place it in a cultural context, and refine the links so that they can become a source of inspiration to our lives.

WORKSHOPS

IOANNA PSALTI & NIKOLAS ANASTASIADIS (UK, AUSTRIA) "DON'T BLAME IT ON ME", SAID THE SECRET.

A secret is tied up with both curiosity and the sense of what is right and wrong. Explorations of forbidden areas out of curiosity like the forbidden fruit in the Garden of Eden give rise to secrets within oneself. Sharing a secret results in the formation of a group with a hidden bond, a type of united sister/brotherhood. Secrets are considered destructive as traditionally the holders of the secret are seen to focus on their hidden bond denying the separation from the world they try to avoid.

This workshop will challenge such perceptions and in particularly what really separates us from the world: the secret itself? how the secret is hold or used? how we define right and wrong? Using a hybrid of psycho- and sociodrama the participants will explore: the independence rising from a united sister/brotherhood where no judgement exists, particularly when curiosity is traded for obedience to society's rules. the function of the hidden bond during the transition period before the secret is revealed; how to manage the 'unknown' special space created by the sharing of the secret.

Nikolas Anastasiadis lives and works in Austria. A passionate, driven clinical psychologist, Nikolas is working as psychotherapist in group and educational settings where he uses psychodrama for personal development and rehabilitation work.

Ioanna Psalti lives and works in the UK. Ioanna is an organisational and strategy advisor. Trained in sociodrama, Ioanna integrates creative action methods to manage diversity and identity issues surfacing in multinational organisations.

Nikolas and Ioanna are both 'professional foreigners' that started the journey from Greece. Kaunas brings them together for a dynamic, explorative and enjoyable workshop.



ENDEL HANGO (ESTONIA)

THE COMPETENT GENIUS – A SECRET ART OF TRAINING

Creative Genius is Moreno's concept of total spontaneous state. In many cases, psychodrama works to train spontaneity, so people are happier, more effective, innovative, etc. The expression "Creative Genius" has gone into masses because the ability to find suitable solutions in new situations and new solutions to old situations is so essential in today's world. Often people think that the creativity and spontaneity just happens, but they are wrong – psychodramatists master the secret art of training spontaneity, which through systemic approach transforms one to become a Competent Genius.

I am the head of Tartu Psychodrama Institute, a trainer and a teacher of psychodrama and playback theatre. I also work in a professional setting with organisations and teams, helping them enhance their creativity and spontaneity. My first education was in psychology and economy. And I love to play with chaos and order, spontaneity and systemic thinking to enhance growth.

KÜLLIKE LILLESTIK (ESTONIA) SECRETS IN FAMILY AND INVISIBLE LOYALTY: PSY-CHODRAMA AND SYSTEMIC FAMILY THERAPY

Family is a system where we belong and it is not possible to cut off or kick out somebody. Yes, it happens, but after that there is a price and there are consequences. Family system is a unity, and all members, alive and dead, born and unborn, are part of it. Everything that is happening is about patterns and order. Can family patterns and problems be passed down through generation as an invisible, unconscious but very real family inheritance? In this workshop I wish to offer you a chance to explore your family system, your place there, and also to investigate the impact of symptoms, dysfunctions and secrets. The workshop is inspired by psychodrama, systemic and multigenerational family therapy, couple therapy and family constellation.

HIDDEN INGREDIENTS OF LEARNING IN PSYCHODRAMA

This workshop is about inspiration and learning in psychodrama: What are internal factors of learning in psychodrama? What makes psychodrama so magically inspiring so that it enables holistic learning?

In the workshop, inspiring elements of psychodrama are explored in a sociometric and sociodramatic process. This is combined with principal concepts of psychodrama and adult learning theories and methods. Some discoveries of Inspirational Pedagogy Network are presented, too.

What is Inspirational Pedagogy Network?

Inspirational Pedagogy is a network of three Morenian Institutes in Estonia, Finland and Norway. The network will describe the pedagogy in training of psychodrama, sociometry and group psychotherapy. This pedagogy is called inspirational pedagogy. The project formulated tacit knowledge of trainers, as well as tools, models and concepts used in their pedagogical approach. The first phase of network lasted from July, 2013, to December, 2014. This was supported by Nordplus Adult.


